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# The Story

Mr Toad is obsessed with current fads only to abandon them abruptly. Mole and Rat visit Mr Toad and he invites them to join him on the open road in his new craze a horse - drawn caravan after giving up boating. When this ends up in disaster he becomes infatuated with motor cars. With Toad out of control, Mole insists Rat and himself head to the wild woods to find Badger. He goes alone and encounters Chief Weasel and his wild wooders, he escapes after Rat has a change of heart and they head off to find Badger for his help.

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Chief Weasel is plotting to steal Toad Hall and Portia ends up being kidnapped. 





